The planet we inhabit is home to various species, each is playing a unique role. However, in recent times, the shadow of extinction looms over many animals, one of them being the African elephant.

This mammal is considered now critically endangered by IUCN every fifteen minutes. It is found in Sub-Saharan African countries. It can live up to 70 years and weighs up to more than 5 tones. The African elephant feeds from fruits, grass, and tree bark. It has got small eyes, long trunk, two ivory tusks and bigger ears than those of Asian elephants. Because of their precious ivory, poachers kill them yearly. Therefore, their number has decreased from 1,3 million to only 400,000 in 2020. And if this continues, this species could be extinct in 10 years.

But as human beings, we must save this animal. First, the government must set severe rules to ban ivory trafficking and punish illegal hunters. Second, international organizations should raise awareness about the importance of protecting this animal's habitat, and third, prevent polluting the environment and cutting down forests. By protecting it, we are not only safeguarding biodiversity but also ensuring the continuity of essential ecosystem services in which human well-being depends.
